
 Town has favorable economic conditions and demographics

Walpole benefits major highway access

- Major highway connections between Boston and Rhode Island
 - Interstate 95
 - Route 1
 - Route 1A
 - Route 27
 - Route 109
 - Washington Street



- Town center train station connects the Northeast
 - Ease of Parking
 - Walk to town center shops

Walpole: Capable Consumers

Income (median household)

- Norfolk County (Walpole) = \$79,000 (highest in state, 28th in USA)
- Walpole = \$93,000
 - Twenty-four percent of population income between \$100,000 & \$149,000
 - Forty-five percent of population between 25-54 years of age
 - Low unemployment rate of 5.4% due to a capable and highly educated workforce

Industry in Walpole

- According to 2013 employment data, the top three sectors with the highest average employment growth are:
 - Health/Medical and Education;
 - Professional/Administrative and Business;
 - Leisure and Hospitality
- Opportunities to align with existing business sectors
- Competitive tax rate of \$21.04 (FY14 CIP)



- Designated municipal staff
 - Dedicated to existing and new business development opportunities
 - Assist businesses to access state programs
- Economic Development Commission
 - Long term planning and marketing of town

Walpole has a favorable permitting process

- Expedited Permitting (MGL Ch.43D)
- Design Review Committee
 - Consisting of Dept. Heads to provide a technical review of small- or large-scale projects
- Permitting Applicant's Handbook and some local permit applications available online



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
