MINUTES CONSERVATION COMMISSION JULY 10, 2019 7:00 PM

The Conservation Agent Report dated July 10, 2019 was given to members.

Wiley opened the meeting at 7PM

7:00 PM:

Request for Determination of Applicability, Diane O'Brien, 12 Maude Terrace:

Wiley opened the hearing and read board comments. Susan McArthur of McArthur Environmental Consulting was present on behalf of the Applicant. McArthur explained to the Commission that she delineated the wetland resource area at the end of May, and that there is an intermittent stream that runs through the backyard and the BVW associated with it. The 100 ft. buffer zone is located in the back corner of the property where the garage and patio currently exist. The Applicant is proposing to take down the existing garage and rebuild a new one within the existing footprint – slightly extending more north, with a second story, which is out of the resource area. Lastly, Applicant is proposing compost sock for erosion control. Hershey recommended a Negative 1 Determination, with the understanding that everything will stay on site, and that any stock piling will have erosion control around it to prevent migration. Wiley opened the hearing to the public for comment which there was none. Goetz motioned to close the hearing, seconded by Dyer the motion carried 6-0-0 (Wiley, Goetz, Dyer, Turner, Di Virgilio, Burchesky).

Continued Notice of Intent/ Amended NOI, SR II Ventures LLC, 8 Gigi's Way, DEP #315-1184:

Wiley opened the hearing, John Glossa of Glossa Engineering was present, along with Applicant Michael Viano of SR II Ventures. Wiley read comments from the Planning Board and Glossa submitted revised plans to the Commission. Hershey stated that the revised plans were dropped off at 3PM this afternoon, and therefore has not had adequate time to review the plans or the revised NOI. Glossa explained that the revised plans include the following; new additional footbridge crossing, construction period plan, size of disturbance within the 25 no disturb area, additional Oak tree plantings, and detail around Pond regarding Tom Liddy's recommendations

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from the last hearing. Goetz stated a letter of support from the abutter of the property should be included into the file, and would like to see more Oak tree plantings on plan. Hershey stated that the plans need to have detail sequencing regarding installation of silt fence, stabilized construction entrance and culvert. Wiley opened the hearing to the public for comment which there was none. With more information needed on the plan and additional time to look over, Goetz motioned to continue the hearing to 8/14/19 at 7:01 PM, seconded by Dyer, the motion carried 6-0-0 (Wiley, Goetz, Dyer, Turner, Di Virgilio, Burchesky)
