Mr. Snuffer called the meeting to order followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND PROCLAMATIONS

DOC Land, Rt 1A

Mr. Snuffer read the public hearing notice from the EOAF regarding the 63+/- acres of land located off RT1A owned by the DOC. This land may be used for Active and passive recreation, open space and facilities. This is to begin the conveyance process from DOC to the Town of Walpole. The town has been working on this for a number of years and our delegation has been helpful, there is always shortage of fields in town and figure how to develop this land in the future. Long-term vision, fundraising going, develop a nice complex. It will take time, 4-5 years down the road it will work out well for the town. The town has the money set aside to buy land at \$400 an acre, \$25,000-\$26,000. The commonwealth just requires this notice be read. Before Planning Board on August 20 for the ANR plan. The amount appropriated at town meeting is \$40,000. A lot of groups have come forward that are offering to assist.

SPONSORED AGENDA ITEMS

8-1 Waiver from Moratorium, Winter Street

The Board is in receipt of a request from the resident of 615 Winter Street to open the street to install Gas. The road was paved last year and the town has a 5 year moratorium on paved roads. Mark, a representative of Columbia Gas was present. The cut will take place near the passenger tire line. The road cut will be 3x5. It is between the white and yellow line. It was noted the Engineering department rejected the request. The homeowner states that his boiler will not last through the winter. Ms. Walker suggested the Board consider creating a policy of what is an acceptable hardship.

Mr. Gallivan would prefer not to dig into a street, but does understand the issue he faces. As long as Maggie feels that the protections in place will insure the road will be put back into place. The process only takes 1 day. Mr. Stanton noted the opinion of his heating expert that his boiler will not make it through another winter. Mark from Columbia Gas explained they have over

1,000 applicants. Depending on hardships, we do want to install. Ms. Walker explained the Gas company will own the road as far as repairs for one year. They have always been cooperative even if it is over one year.

MOTION moved by Mr. Gallivan to grant the waiver from the five year moratorium for a street opening permit at 615 Winter Street to allow the installation of Gas subject to the conditions set forth in a memo from the Town Engineer dated July 29, 2015 being adhered to seconded by Mr. Stanton. VOTED 5-0-0
