3-6 <u>Dispatcher, Police Dept</u>

John Carmichael as you know we would like to get an additional dispatcher. We average 100,000 calls a year. The state 911 system is very involved. New EMD training. Initial 40 hour dispatcher class, additional 411 class. The dispatchers are very tasked. Committed to the EMD portion of that call. Currently we have two on most days and some 4-12 shifts. The ADCO standards we should have 7.5 we have six. We want to get the funding through the grant. Put that towards personal. Pay the rest out of the budget. Looking for your support. It is definitely something we need. Really difficult if they are doing this by themselves and dispatch all the apparatus. So the need is there to have two dispatchers on.

There was discussion regarding the grant. The Deputy Chief stated the grant is much a given now. There are so many mandates, we are confident; we can not say 100%. We should be able to get the \$35,000. It also forecast that you can get this grant on an annual basis. The Deputy does not see that ending. We are obligated to provide this much training in dispatch. Ask more out of them. It was asked if they would have an issue with making the approval contingent upon receipt annually of the grant.

The Deputy Chief stated they will probably look at 5-7 thousand coming out of the budget. They are comfortable with the \$35,000. They do not need approval to apply. The Board could approve this contingent upon of a grant being received in the amount of \$35,000. The Police Department also needs help with the computer. It will probably go in next week. They will hear back sometime in July. Mrs. Mackenzie so is it safe to say you will get it every year, but you can't say what the state budget will be year to year. The Deputy Chief stated it could but with the mandates, it has to go in there. She asked if this is something the Town has to comply with? Will be mandated to have two dispatchers. Deputy Chief state no, they have to be EMD, 40 hours training. The police officers do as well in order for them to sit there and answer the phone. Close to half of the officers have done this. We do not need to have everyone trained.

Number of bedrooms, bathrooms and overall condition of the house. We pick up a lot of things. People do a lot of things they did not do with a permit. Example a house from the 30-40s that redoes the kitchen but does not pull a permit. Mr. Flis stated every year there are

During a revaluation, the BOA, we contract out for technical assistance. We do all the in-house for the residential values. I do the analysis of the sales and I need assistance to do the building permits. There is a re-inspection of the property. In the past I use retired assessors or vendors.

If there is money coming from Federal Grants, they tend to be for Fire Dept. If this allows us to be ready to go and if we do get the block grant for the senior center. If the State funding comes back. She would not get a project manager on Board and then they are not qualified to the other projects. She wants to make sure when we go to Fin Com they are clear on the answer.

Police Union Contract

Mr. Johnson explained that within this contract the union is getting back the Quinn. For anyone receiving benefits as of July 1, 2009 shall continue to receive the same benefits as of that date. Those hired after July 1, 2009 will be eligible starting July 1, 2015 for 1/3 and increase over the next two fiscal years until June 30 2017 they will receive 100% of the Quinn. The Deputy Chief was also present. The contract also includes the repeal of Civil Service if approved by Town Meeting. The Deputy Chief explained they are close to closing out the policy for Civil Service. Mr. Johnson explained we ran all this by Kevin Feeley. Mr. Snuffer despises the
