28 County Street - Demolition Request

All four members of the Commission, along with the two property owners, attended a site visit at 28 County Street immediately prior to the meeting.

Mark Almeda made a motion that the two decks at 28 County Street are not architecturally or historically significant. Christine Cochrane seconded the motion.

The motion passed 4-0-0.

453 Winter Street:

455 Willer Street.
Mr. Almeda reported that this house, formerly owned by the late Betty Cottrell, is being proposed for demolition. The house was built in the 1700s. The Commission will plan hold a site visit and meeting on June 11.
Meeting Minutes:
