In my opinion the history of the Omin Development 40B site must be presented to the public hearing, because it is very germane to the public health of the Town. When a Developer proposed an Age Qualified Village (AQV) on the former Bird Machine property that was then owned by Baker Hughes. The Town engaged an environmental professional. Who found contamination on the site preventing the proposed Age Qualified Village from going forward? A Hydrologist engage for the Town performed a study and proved the site was in Area 3 and the Aquifer of forty feet or less was within the draw down of the School Meadow Brook Well Field. Making the proposed AQV site in the Towns public water supply. Therefore, The proposed 40B is also in the public water supply, and the Board of Health needs to address this very serious public health environmental insult before the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) takes any actions. Please accept this notice as a request for the Freedom of Information for the studies and reports performed about the AQV proving it is in a very sensitive area. This 40B site is Aquifer of 40 feet or less, hydrologic ally connected to the School Meadow Brook Well Field, and within the DEP draw down definition of Zone II back then a half a mile or more. The 40B can't circumvent controls in place to protect public health via our public water supply. This is stipulated in the state's comprehensive permit guide. Please provide all information gathered by the Planning Board, Water and Sewer, Conservation Commission, then Board of Selectmen, Town Moderator, and Town Clerk dealing with the AQV submission.
