Dear Chairman: In my opinion

Town Employee's and Resident's will suffer serious Hardships if this project is built. The need to support our newest Fire Equipment required to fight fires in this project require the roads and bridges to be built to a higher standard to carry earth crushing weight that will cause these new roads to form earthen dams on the floor of the ZONE II Aquifer Walpole's drinking water supply. Dams which will change how drinking water meanders in the Aquifer. If water is diverted from our Drinking water wells that is a very big hardship for the property owners (tax payers). This 40B is needed less than WATER.

Today water delusion keeps the carcinogenic material below maximum contaminants levels. For example PFAS6 is at 16.3 ppt in 2022, 20 ppt is the highest amount allowed. An increase of 3.8 ppt and it is no longer drinking water. A significant hardship, which demands this 40B, be denied by the ZBA.

The risk of loss of millions of gallons of drinking water is a potential real hardship for Walpole's tax payers, and employees. During an emergency we can draw 2 million from Mine Brook with 1½ million needed from the MWRA. They will demand putting SLUDGE in their approved Sludge dump.

Walpole sewerd the fields. The Walpole Prison complex abuts the fields, therefor, the prison complex can hookup to our sewer by right. The MWRA 94 acre sludge dump site abuts Walpole Prison, therefor, the Sludge Dump can hookup by right once Walpole prison hooks up. This is a hardship for all property owners within a mile of the perimeter/boundary of the 94 acre sludge dump. Property values in South Walpole and West Walpole will drop causing property tax in North, and East Walpole to increase.

MAPC states clear cutting trees by the 40B sheds water from the ZONE II Aquifer beneath the 40B project. This is another major hardship reducing delusion putting our drinking water at risk for exceeding the maximum contaminant level. Again, signicant reason, for ZBA to deny this 40B.

Testing of the Aquifer ZONE II below the 40B project must be required by the ZBA and monitored by a Hydrologist, and the Board of Health to prevent a hardship for the future occupants of the 40B.
