I've watched friends battle cancer in front of their children & that is something I never wish on anyone, I've watched friends not beat it & leave this world & leave their entire whole world behind, does Omni care about that?

I spend nights tallying cancer clusters & new ALS diagnoses in young people, checking water supply reports like my mama is shouting from heaven to me to not stop digging.

Our water supply, the only aquifer that supplies water to our entire town is sitting in between the contaminated Bird Factory & this 40B proposal, the water we drink, the water we bathe our kids in, that we wash our dishes with, we shower in, that is something I am terrified about.

The testing that was done was less than adequate I have reached out to Erin Brockovich thousands of times, I don't want to be her next movie & I am sure you don't either. But, we could be.

I went head to head with Mr. Hale & rattled him on the contaminated land & he is hiding something & we need your help.

Of course there are traffic concerns, school crowding, but more importantly a one way in & out for our Police & Fire & how down right terrifying that is for them, but the biggest issue is digging up this land & what it could do to all of us should be the top priority, I mean how could anyone that approves this live with themselves if the research wasn't done.
