C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

The following conditions are only applicable to Approved projects.

- Failure to comply with all conditions stated herein, and with all related statutes and other regulatory measures, shall be deemed cause to revoke or modify this Order.
- amount here. 2. The Order does not grant any property rights or any exclusive privileges; it does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights.
 - 3. This Order does not relieve the permittee or any other person of the necessity of complying with all other applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, bylaws, or regulations.
 - 4. The work authorized hereunder shall be completed within three years from the date of this Order unless either of the following apply:
 - a. The work is a maintenance dredging project as provided for in the Act; or
 - b. The time for completion has been extended to a specified date more than three years, but less than five years, from the date of issuance. If this Order is intended to be valid for more than three years, the extension date and the special circumstances warranting the extended time period are set forth as a special condition in this Order.
 - c. If the work is for a Test Project, this Order of Conditions shall be valid for no more than one year.
 - 5. This Order may be extended by the issuing authority for one or more periods of up to three years each upon application to the issuing authority at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of the Order. An Order of Conditions for a Test Project may be extended for one additional year only upon written application by the applicant, subject to the provisions of 310 CMR 10.05(11)(f).
 - 6. If this Order constitutes an Amended Order of Conditions, this Amended Order of Conditions does not extend the issuance date of the original Final Order of Conditions and the Order will expire on _____ unless extended in writing by the Department.
 - 7. Any fill used in connection with this project shall be clean fill. Any fill shall contain no trash, refuse, rubbish, or debris, including but not limited to lumber, bricks, plaster, wire, lath, paper, cardboard, pipe, tires, ashes, refrigerators, motor vehicles, or parts of any of the foregoing.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

- 8. This Order is not final until all administrative appeal periods from this Order have elapsed, or if such an appeal has been taken, until all proceedings before the Department have been completed.
- 9. No work shall be undertaken until the Order has become final and then has been recorded in the Registry of Deeds or the Land Court for the district in which the land is located, within the chain of title of the affected property. In the case of recorded land, the Final Order shall also be noted in the Registry's Grantor Index under the name of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is to be done. In the case of the registered land, the Final Order shall also be noted on the Land Court Certificate of Title of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is done. The recording information shall be submitted to the Conservation Commission on the form at the end of this Order, which form must be stamped by the Registry of Deeds, prior to the commencement of work.
- A sign shall be displayed at the site not less then two square feet or more than three square feet in size bearing the words,

"Massachusetts Department of I	Environmental Protection" [or, "MassDEP"]

- 11. Where the Department of Environmental Protection is requested to issue a Superseding Order, the Conservation Commission shall be a party to all agency proceedings and hearings before MassDEP.
- 12. Upon completion of the work described herein, the applicant shall submit a Request for Certificate of Compliance (WPA Form 8A) to the Conservation Commission.
- 13. The work shall conform to the plans and special conditions referenced in this order.
- 14. Any change to the plans identified in Condition #13 above shall require the applicant to inquire of the Conservation Commission in writing whether the change is significant enough to require the filing of a new Notice of Intent.
- 15. The Agent or members of the Conservation Commission and the Department of Environmental Protection shall have the right to enter and inspect the area subject to this Order at reasonable hours to evaluate compliance with the conditions stated in this Order, and may require the submittal of any data deemed necessary by the Conservation Commission or Department for that evaluation.
- 16. This Order of Conditions shall apply to any successor in interest or successor in control of the property subject to this Order and to any contractor or other person performing work conditioned by this Order.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- 17. Prior to the start of work, and if the project involves work adjacent to a Bordering Vegetated Wetland, the boundary of the wetland in the vicinity of the proposed work area shall be marked by wooden stakes or flagging. Once in place, the wetland boundary markers shall be maintained until a Certificate of Compliance has been issued by the Conservation Commission.
- 18. All sedimentation barriers shall be maintained in good repair until all disturbed areas have been fully stabilized with vegetation or other means. At no time shall sediments be deposited in a wetland or water body. During construction, the applicant or his/her designee shall inspect the erosion controls on a daily basis and shall remove accumulated sediments as needed. The applicant shall immediately control any erosion problems that occur at the site and shall also immediately notify the Conservation Commission, which reserves the right to require additional erosion and/or damage prevention controls it may deem necessary. Sedimentation barriers shall serve as the limit of work unless another limit of work line has been approved by this Order.
- 19. The work associated with this Order (the "Project")
 (1) ☐ is subject to the Massachusetts Stormwater Standards

If the work is subject to the Stormwater Standards, then the project is subject to the following conditions:

- a) All work, including site preparation, land disturbance, construction and redevelopment, shall be implemented in accordance with the construction period pollution prevention and erosion and sedimentation control plan and, if applicable, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan required by the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Construction General Permit as required by Stormwater Condition 8. Construction period erosion, sedimentation and pollution control measures and best management practices (BMPs) shall remain in place until the site is fully stabilized.
- b) No stormwater runoff may be discharged to the post-construction stormwater BMPs unless and until a Registered Professional Engineer provides a Certification that:

 i. all construction period BMPs have been removed or will be removed by a date certain specified in the Certification. For any construction period BMPs intended to be converted to post construction operation for stormwater attenuation, recharge, and/or treatment, the conversion is allowed by the MassDEP Stormwater Handbook BMP specifications and that the BMP has been properly cleaned or prepared for post construction operation, including removal of all construction period sediment trapped in inlet and outlet control structures;

 ii. as-built final construction BMP plans are included, signed and stamped by a Registered Professional Engineer, certifying the site is fully stabilized;

 iii. any illigit discharges to the starmwater management system have been removed.

iii. any illicit discharges to the stormwater management system have been removed, as per the requirements of Stormwater Standard 10:



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

iv. all post-construction stormwater BMPs are installed in accordance with the plans (including all planting plans) approved by the issuing authority, and have been inspected to ensure that they are not damaged and that they are in proper working condition;

v. any vegetation associated with post-construction BMPs is suitably established to withstand erosion.

- c) The landowner is responsible for BMP maintenance until the issuing authority is notified that another party has legally assumed responsibility for BMP maintenance. Prior to requesting a Certificate of Compliance, or Partial Certificate of Compliance, the responsible party (defined in General Condition 18(e)) shall execute and submit to the issuing authority an Operation and Maintenance Compliance Statement ("O&M Statement) for the Stormwater BMPs identifying the party responsible for implementing the stormwater BMP Operation and Maintenance Plan ("O&M Plan") and certifying the following:
 - i.) the O&M Plan is complete and will be implemented upon receipt of the Certificate of Compliance, and
 - ii.) the future responsible parties shall be notified in writing of their ongoing legal responsibility to operate and maintain the stormwater management BMPs and implement the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan.
- d) Post-construction pollution prevention and source control shall be implemented in accordance with the long-term pollution prevention plan section of the approved Stormwater Report and, if applicable, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan required by the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Multi-Sector General Permit.
- e) Unless and until another party accepts responsibility, the landowner, or owner of any drainage easement, assumes responsibility for maintaining each BMP. To overcome this presumption, the landowner of the property must submit to the issuing authority a legally binding agreement of record, acceptable to the issuing authority, evidencing that another entity has accepted responsibility for maintaining the BMP, and that the proposed responsible party shall be treated as a permittee for purposes of implementing the requirements of Conditions 18(f) through 18(k) with respect to that BMP. Any failure of the proposed responsible party to implement the requirements of Conditions 18(f) through 18(k) with respect to that BMP shall be a violation of the Order of Conditions or Certificate of Compliance. In the case of stormwater BMPs that are serving more than one lot, the legally binding agreement shall also identify the lots that will be serviced by the stormwater BMPs. A plan and easement deed that grants the responsible party access to perform the required operation and maintenance must be submitted along with the legally binding agreement.
- f) The responsible party shall operate and maintain all stormwater BMPs in accordance with the design plans, the O&M Plan, and the requirements of the Massachusetts Stormwater Handbook.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- g) The responsible party shall:
 - 1. Maintain an operation and maintenance log for the last three (3) consecutive calendar years of inspections, repairs, maintenance and/or replacement of the stormwater management system or any part thereof, and disposal (for disposal the log shall indicate the type of material and the disposal location);
 - 2. Make the maintenance log available to MassDEP and the Conservation Commission ("Commission") upon request; and
 - Allow members and agents of the MassDEP and the Commission to enter and
 inspect the site to evaluate and ensure that the responsible party is in compliance
 with the requirements for each BMP established in the O&M Plan approved by the
 issuing authority.
- h) All sediment or other contaminants removed from stormwater BMPs shall be disposed of in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- i) Illicit discharges to the stormwater management system as defined in 310 CMR 10.04 are prohibited.
- j) The stormwater management system approved in the Order of Conditions shall not be changed without the prior written approval of the issuing authority.
- k) Areas designated as qualifying pervious areas for the purpose of the Low Impact Site Design Credit (as defined in the MassDEP Stormwater Handbook, Volume 3, Chapter 1, Low Impact Development Site Design Credits) shall not be altered without the prior written approval of the issuing authority.
- I) Access for maintenance, repair, and/or replacement of BMPs shall not be withheld. Any fencing constructed around stormwater BMPs shall include access gates and shall be at least six inches above grade to allow for wildlife passage.

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F. Appeals

The applicant, the owner, any person aggrieved by this Order, any owner of land abutting the land subject to this Order, or any ten residents of the city or town in which such land is located, are hereby notified of their right to request the appropriate MassDEP Regional Office to issue a Superseding Order of Conditions. The request must be made by certified mail or hand delivery to the Department, with the appropriate filling fee and a completed Request for Departmental Action Fee Transmittal Form, as provided in 310 CMR 10.03(7) within ten business days from the date of issuance of this Order. A copy of the request shall at the same time be sent by certified mail or hand delivery to the Conservation Commission and to the applicant, if he/she is not the appellant.

Any appellants seeking to appeal the Department's Superseding Order associated with this appeal will be required to demonstrate prior participation in the review of this project. Previous participation in the permit proceeding means the submission of written information to the Conservation Commission prior to the close of the public hearing, requesting a Superseding Order, or providing written information to the Department prior to issuance of a Superseding Order.

The request shall state clearly and concisely the objections to the Order which is being appealed and how the Order does not contribute to the protection of the interests identified in the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (M.G.L. c. 131, § 40), and is inconsistent with the wetlands regulations (310 CMR 10.00). To the extent that the Order is based on a municipal ordinance or bylaw, and not on the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act or regulations, the Department has no appellate jurisdiction.

WALPOLE WETLANDS PROTECTION BYLAW AND THE MASSACHUSETTSWETLAND PROTECTION ACT SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Findings: This Order of Conditions is issued to the Town of Walpole to construct 5-foot wide sidewalk along Union Street from Brook street to the Norwood town line within 100 feet of bordering vegetative wetlands and within 200 feet of Traphole Brook and a tributary to Traphole Brook.

- 1. This Order shall apply to any successor in control or successor in interest of the property described in the Notice of Intent and accompanying plans. These obligations shall be expressed in covenants in all deeds to succeeding owners of portions of the property.
- 2. The Walpole Conservation Commission shall be notified in writing at the time of all transfers of title on this property prior to the issuance of the Certificate of Compliance. All buyers, purchasers, successors and/or assigns shall certify to the Walpole Conservation Commission receipt of a copy of the plan of record, Notice of Intent, and Order of Conditions for this project. A copy of said certificate shall be provided to the Commission upon transfer of title.
- 3. The Conservation Commission reserves the right to enter upon the property at reasonable hours to inspect the site for compliance with all orders issued herein.
- 4. The form provided at the end of this Order shall be completed and stamped at the Registry of Deeds. This form should be returned to the Commission prior to the commencement of work. Construction may commence after the expiration of the 10-day appeal period and if no request for appeal has been filed with the Department of Environmental Protection. Any Order not recorded by the Applicant before work commences may be recorded by the Commission at the Applicant's expense.
- 5. For any change made or intended to be made in the plans or in the work, the applicant shall file a new Notice of Intent or inquire in writing of the Commission whether or not the change is substantial enough to require a new Notice of Intent.
- 6. This document shall be included in all construction contracts and subcontracts dealing with the work proposed and shall supersede other contract requirements.
- 7. All contractors and all subcontractors shall be given a copy of this Order of Conditions before they commence to work. During the construction phase for this project, an on-site foreman, directing engineer, or designated construction manager shall have a copy of this Order of Conditions at the site, familiarize him or herself with the conditions of this Order of Conditions and adhere to such conditions.
- 8. Prior to any work commencing, a sign shall be displayed showing **DEP File No. 315-1283** preferably not placed on a living tree.

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- 9. The Walpole Conservation Commission shall be notified in writing at least two business days in advance of construction to enable the Commission to inspect the site to ensure that the conditions have been met.
- 10. Failure to comply with this Order of Conditions may result in revocation of this Order of Conditions and may require a refiling by the Applicant. If warranted, an Enforcement Order and fines may also apply.
- 11. **Prior to construction** the construction site manager or Applicant project manager (persons who will oversee the project on site and who has the ability to make decision) shall furnish the Conservation Agent with their names, address and 24-hour telephone number.
- 12. All siltation and erosion controls as specified on the plan shall be employed. Prior to the commencement of construction on the site, siltation controls shall be placed upgradient of all resource areas along the limit of activity as shown on the plan, between all disturbed areas and the wetlands resource areas.
- 13. Adequate erosion and sedimentation control measures shall be implemented and maintained in their proper effectiveness during the entire construction phase for this project. Such erosion control measures shall be monitored on a daily basis, or as needed, and be reinforced or replaced when needed, per judgment of the site foreman and/or Conservation Commission. Such erosion and sedimentation control devices shall remain in place until the site has become stabilized with an adequate vegetative cover. In order to maintain vegetation cover, six (6) inches of loam shall be used. Stablization of slopes with vegetation shall be completed within two weeks after the backfilling of the foundation.
- 14. Silt sac© shall be placed in the catch basins prior to construction and maintained through out the project to completion.
- 15. All stockpile areas shall be located outside the buffer zone, or when space is limited, as far as possible from the resource area. Any stockpiles within a resource area buffer zone shall be surrounded by erosion controls.
- 16. **The Conservation Commission shall be notified** within 72 hours when the culverts for Traphole brook will be crossed.
- 17. **The Town Engineer shall verify** in writing to the Commission that the culvert crossing has occurred.

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- 18. **The Conservation Commission shall be notified** if the culverts are compromised or if any issues pertaining to flow through the culverts is detected during or after construction of the sidewalks.
- 19. **Upon completion of this project**, the Applicant shall **submit** the following to the Conservation Commission to receive a Certificate of Compliance.
 - a. A letter from the Applicant requesting a Certificate of Compliance with the name and address of the person who will receive the original for the purpose of recording at the Registry of Deeds.
 - b. A written statement from a Registered Engineer certifying that the work has been conducted as shown on the plan(s) and documents referenced in the Order of Conditions or any variations from the plans.
 - c. An "as-built" plan that include all items from the original plan including grades and plantings if applicable prepared and signed and stamped by a registered professional engineer or land surveyor of the Commonwealth, for the public record.
