### Completing the Application

1. Voter Information – Provide your name, the address where you are registered to vote, and date of birth.
2. Ballot Information – Provide the address where you want the ballot mailed. If you are applying for a special state primary ballot, choose a party ballot if you are not registered in a party (Independent)
3. Assistance – If you're helping someone complete this application, or you're requesting a ballot for a family member, fill out this section.
4. Sign your name. If you require assistance in signing the application, you may authorize someone to sign your name in your presence. That person must complete the assisting person's information in Section 3.

### Submitting the Application

Application can be mailed or hand-delivered. Application may also be submitted electronically by e-mail to [townclerk@walpole-ma.gov](mailto:townclerk@walpole-ma.gov) or by fax to 508-660-7297, as long as your signature is visible.

Please allow ample mailing time for this application and the ballot. Ballots must be returned to your local election official by Election Day.
